Creative Grids Designer- Deb Heatherly



Deb is the designer of the Creative Grids CGRDH1-Cat's Cradle Tool, CGRDH2-Strippy Stars Tool, CGRDH3- Turbo 4-Patch, and CGRDH4 Ultimate Flying Geese Tool. She is also the author of four books that are companions to these tools- 'Cat'itude, Strippy Stars, 4-Patch Panache, and The Ultimate Flying Geese Book.



Join us on June 4 at 7:00 for a lecture, trunk show, and demo featuring quilts from Deb's new book and a number of other quilts made with Creative Grids tools.

There will be a workshop on June 5 from 9:00-3:00. Deb will be teaching us all of the ins and outs of making pineapple pinwheels and will go over the new Ultimate Flying Geese tool. She will also cover how the Stripology tool makes multiple cuts ($\frac{1}{4}$ " cuts included) thus reducing your cutting time on any quilt. Bring a pencil and paper to take notes! You don't want to miss this opportunity to hear about Creative Grids and how these tools will make your quilting faster, easier, and more precise. No ruler purchase necessary to take the workshop. Deb will have rulers to share in class.

Please cut and bring:

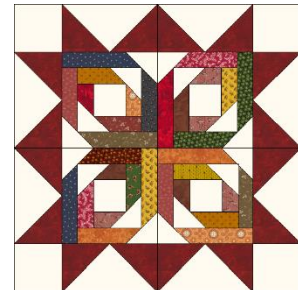
Light Background: Should have good contrast with the colors below. (Bring extra in case you make a mistake)

- (12) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
- (24) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

Colors:(there are 4 different blues in the runner shown), but your colors can be scrappier with lots of colors, or just use 1 color throughout.

- A total of (12) $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips (If using 4 colors bring 3 strips of each=12) We will sub-cut them in class so bring a small ruler. TIP: left over jelly roll strips from other projects can be cut down to $1\frac{3}{4}$ " and make a great 'scrappy' runner. (Bring a few extra strips if you want a safety net in case of a mistake)

Also Bring:(2) 9" squares of a dark fabric and (2) $7\frac{1}{2}$ " and (4) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares fabric. We will use these to make flying geese and talk about how you can use the pineapple pinwheel block and flying geese units to make the block at the end of this block is in my new pattern "Scrappily Ever After".

Other items to bring:

- Your machine and $\frac{1}{4}$ " foot
- Rotary cutter with fresh blade and small cutting mat
- Ruler (A 6 x 12" would be great)
- Scissors
- Seam ripper
- Straight pins
- Iron and small ironing surface
- Pen or pencil to take notes

Also: Bring a CGRJAW3- Pineapple Trim tool and/or CGRDH4 Ultimate Flying Geese Tool if you have one. I will have several to share in class if you don't.

I look forward to working with your group and showing you all the fun ways to use this technique!

Supply List for Padfolio

	For a 5 x 7 or 5 x 8 notepad	For an 8.5 x 11 notepad
Outside Fabric	10 " tall x 15.5" wide	14" tall x 23" wide
Inside Fabric	9" tall x 14.5" wide	13" tall x 22" wide
Notepad Pocket Fabric	16" tall x 6.5" wide	22" tall x 9.5" wide
Slant Pocket Fabric	14" tall x 7.5" wide	21" tall x 10.5" wide
Pen Pocket Fabric	11" tall x 4" wide	11" tall x 4" wide
Peltex 72 (thick, double sided fusible inner-facing)	9" x 14.5"	13" x 22"
OR Peltex 70 (thick, not fusible) and 2 pieces of double sided fusible that can be machine stitched	All 3 pieces should be 9" x 14.5"	All 3 pieces should be 13" x 22"
OR Peltex 71 (thick, one sided fusible) and 1 piece of double sided fusible that can be machine stitched	Both pieces should be 9" x 14.5"	Both pieces should be 13" x 22"
OR Timtex (thick, not fusible) and 2 pieces of double sided fusible that can be machine stitched	All 3 pieces should be 9" x 14.5"	All 3 pieces should be 13" x 22"
Wonder Under, Heat N Bond light, or other double sided fusible that can be machine stitched – NOT Heat N Bond heavy	3 Pieces: 8" x 6", 7" x 7", 5.5" x 3.5"	3 pieces: 11" x 9", 10.5" x 10.5", 5.5" x 3.5"

Thread to match or contrast – IT WILL SHOW IN BOTH THE BOBBIN AND THE TOP THREAD; pre-wind at least 2 bobbins

Rotary Cutter and Mat

Sewing machine capable of sewing a wide (5mm to 7mm), tight satin stitch, extension cord

Size 90/14 Top Stitch needles (at least 2)

Marking chalk/pencil that will show on your chosen pocket fabric

Glue Stick

Approximately 1 ½" button or bead for closure and approximately 36" of cord, ribbon, braid, or yarn for tie

NOTE: The outside fabric will be cut into 3 pieces when you make the Padfolio, so if there is a motif on the fabric that you wish to have placed on the front or back or narrow fold-over piece, you should bring extra fabric so you can fussy cut as you wish. You may wish to do this special cutting in class.

Front Piece	6.75" x 10"	10.5" x 14"
Back Piece	7.25" x 10"	11" x 14"
Narrow Fold-over Piece	3.25" x 10"	3.5" x 14"
